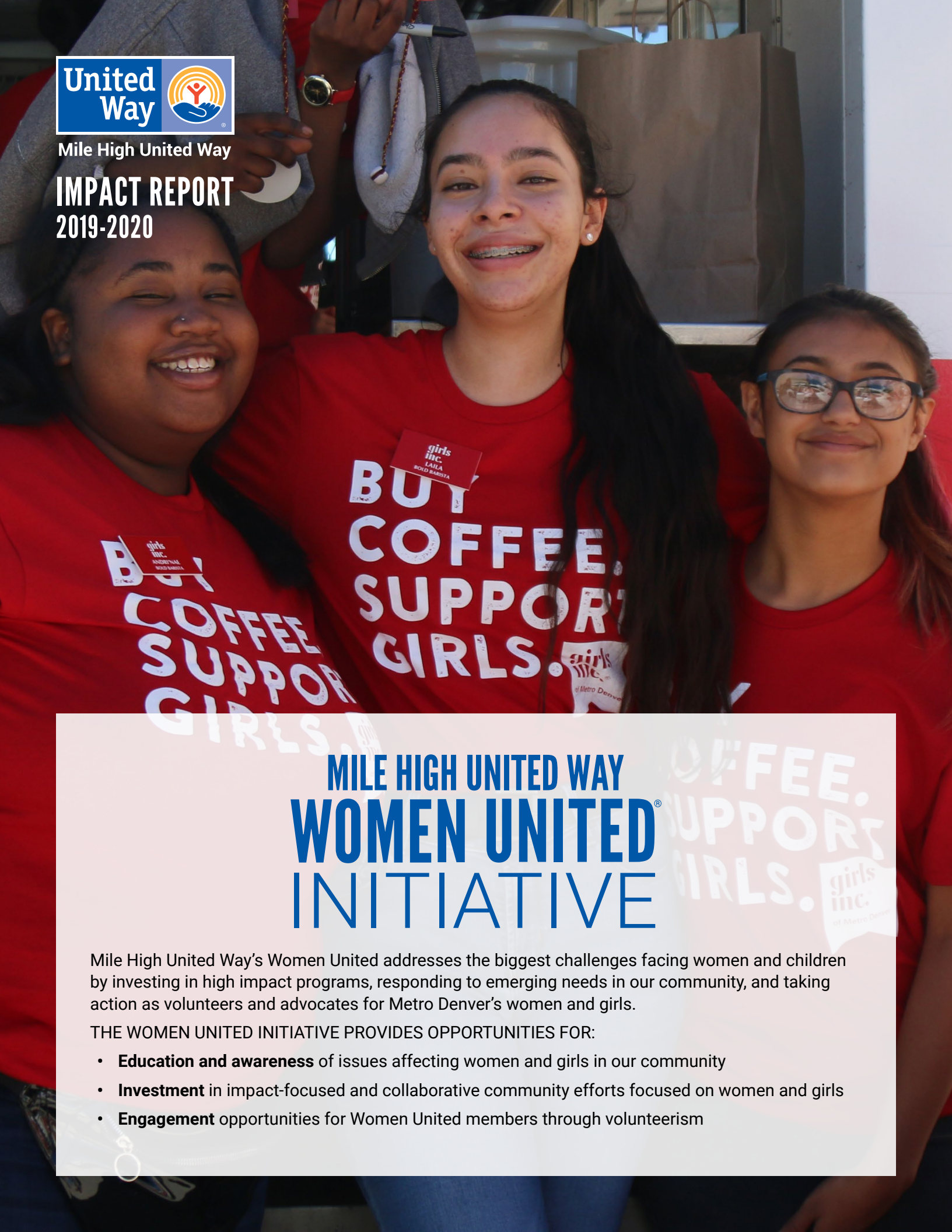

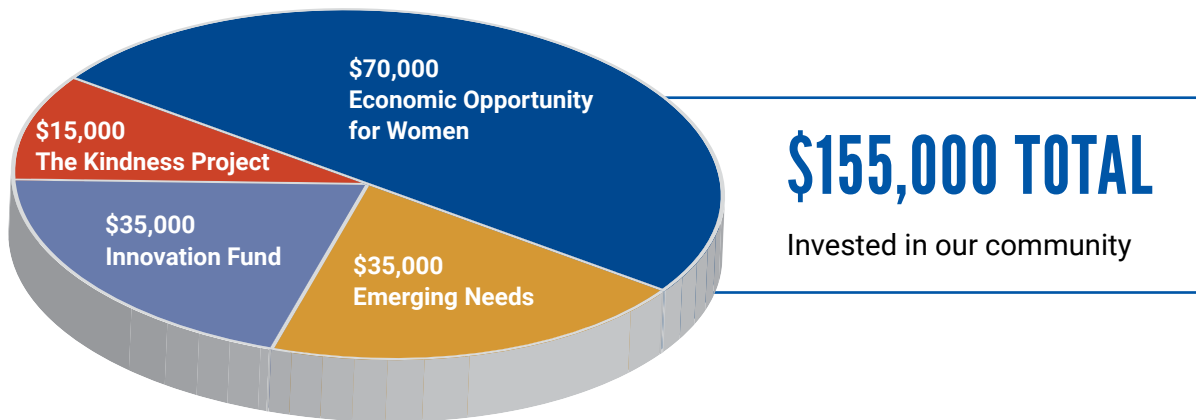

INNOVATION FUND: ECDC AFRICAN COMMUNITY CENTER DRIVING OPPORTUNITY

The ECDC African Community Center's Driving Opportunity will be a female-centered, affordable driving school, run for women by women. Driving Opportunity will offer culturally competent driving classes and in-car instruction to best meet diverse refugee and immigrant clients' cultural and religious needs.

The COVID-19 pandemic has required this program's start be put on hold, but the ECDC African Community Center is looking forward to helping women gain greater access to independence, income, and opportunity through their driving program.



Though the Driving Opportunity program was unexpectedly delayed due to COVID-19, the ECDC African Community Center has continued to serve refugee and immigrant women with their most important needs. We look forward to sharing the progress and impact of this program to all Women United Initiative investors once it is able to launch.”

EMERGING NEEDS

The Emerging Needs funding supports an emerging need identified by Mile High United Way annually. This year, the funding has been allocated to the YMCA for their after-school program.

Out-of-school programming was upturned by the COVID-19 pandemic and the YMCA had to develop new and innovative ways to engage students and their parents. Although outreach to students was difficult, the YMCA connected with them around food security, realizing that many families relied on meals provided during the school day. A partnership with The GrowHaus offered a solution and food boxes were (and continue to be) delivered weekly. The YMCA also made sure families had school supplies throughout the remainder of the school year.

Because of your investment, 369 students were provided with enriching out-of-school-time programs, and an overwhelming majority of those students continued to receive the food security support they needed.
