YOUR IMPACT: WOMEN UNITED INITIATIVE



Through our **INNOVATION FUND**, women and girls at A Precious Child's Precious Perks program are being trained for excellence in the job market through working at the Social Enterprise Coffee and Gift Shop.

Through our **ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY FOR WOMEN FUND**, 7,550 girls and women received job coaching, gained employment, or received academic support.

Through our **EMERGING NEEDS FUND**, in partnership with the COVID Relief Fund, over 3,500 families were connected with basic needs resources and support, over 100 students received laptops for remote learning, and over 5,000 first responders were assisted with child care services.

Through our **KINDNESS PROJECT**, approximately \$20,000 of diaper donations and other baby supplies were collected for young families in our community.
